A comprehensive Maine Department of Transportation study has shown that the state of Maine would save between \$1.7 and \$2.3 million a year in reduced pavement repair. According to the U.S. Department of Transportation, there would be a 20-year pavement restoration cost savings of nearly \$2.5 billion utilizing a 97,000-pound six-axle truck.

In supporting the measure, Richard Gratton, president and CEO of the Maine Restaurant Association said, "The trucks are not longer or wider, they simply add an extra axle and additional brakes to safety handle the extra weight."

The Maine Municipal Association is gathering information and data from municipalities illustrating the positive impacts the weight limit increase has had on the respective municipalities, business and residents.

Author, TV personality, and former drag-queen Josh Kilmer-Purcell makes readers flock to his corner with gently sarcastic, Midwest-cum-New-York humor, and it's hard not to cheer for his triumphs and feel genuinely sad at his discouragements. Kilmer-Purcell isn't afraid to show his dream with warts, and he wears his emotions on his sleeve - both the good and the bad - which only adds to the appeal of his book.
